What was funded?

Whole Person Care

Placer County's Whole Person Care is a pilot program designed to help high-need individuals, the majority of whom are chronically homeless, with multiple problems get necessary services. The Getting to Zero funds from Sutter Health funded the purchase of two properties with a total of 14 bedrooms in Placer County to provide permanent supportive housing.

185 Average days from program entry to obtaining permanent housing



How are people better off?

4 Housing Outcomes

Obtained a housing subsidy or voucher | 3 (20% of individuals served)
Clients still in permanent housing after program exit | 1 (7% of individuals served)

52 Case Management Outcomes

Obtained basic needs | 17
Received case management services after securing permanent housing | 28
Received new form of monthly income | 2
Obtained permanent employment | 2
Maintained permanent employment | 3
