What was funded?

Triage Shelter

The Triage Shelter is a 24-hour shelter that serves up to 200 adults experiencing homelessness. The shelter was designed to accommodate individuals with complex needs, long histories of homelessness, and higher barriers to accessing the traditional shelter system. Using best practices to end homelessness, the Triage Shelter provides a supervised temporary living environment, including intakes, assessments, case management services, three meals and snacks daily, personal supplies, shower and laundry facilities, transportation, accommodations for pets, and storage.

Exited to permanent housing | 28 (8% of individuals served)
Exited to a transitional housing program | 4 (1% of individuals served)
Exited to a residential treatment facility | 3 (1% of individuals served)
Obtained a housing subsidy or voucher | 9 (3% of individuals served)
